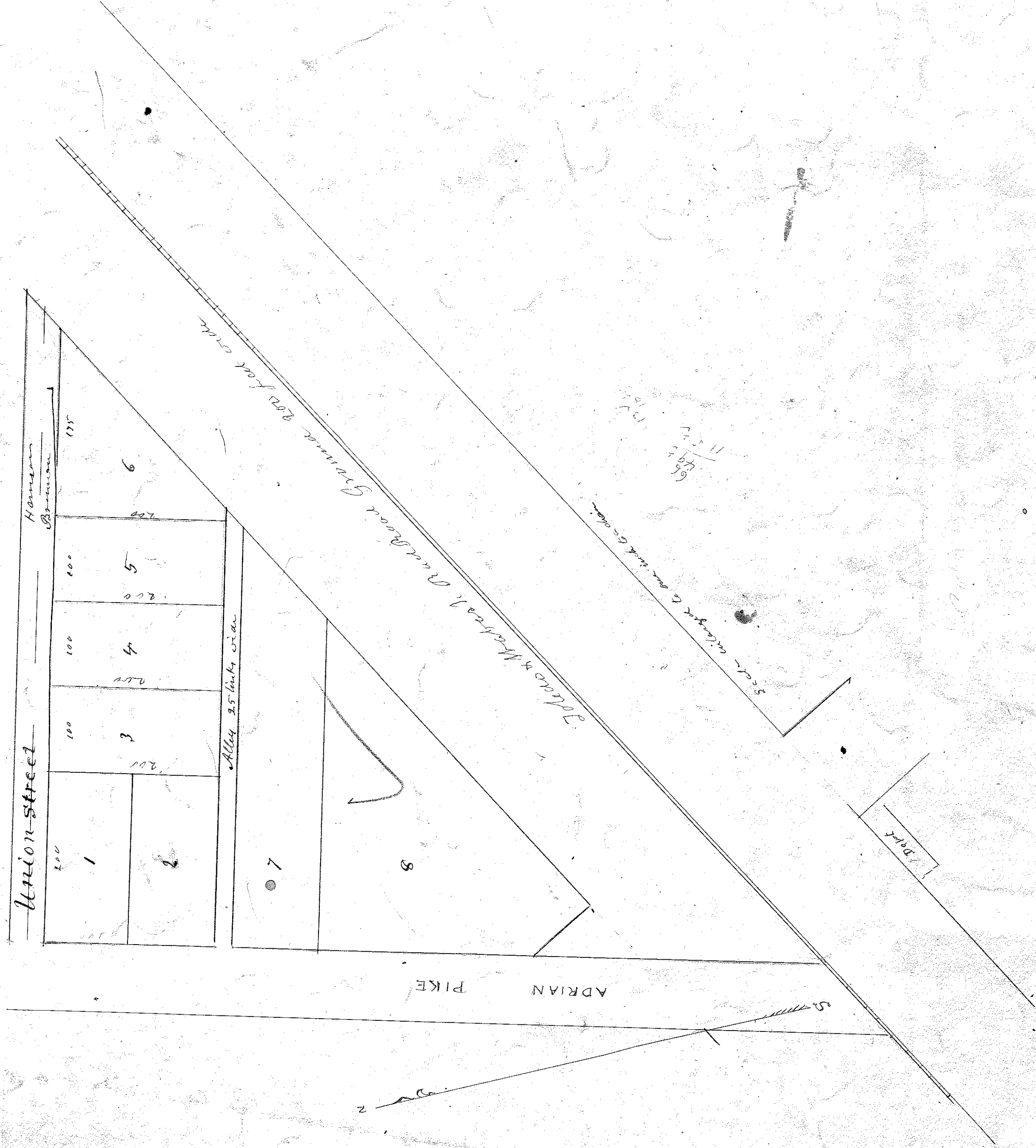


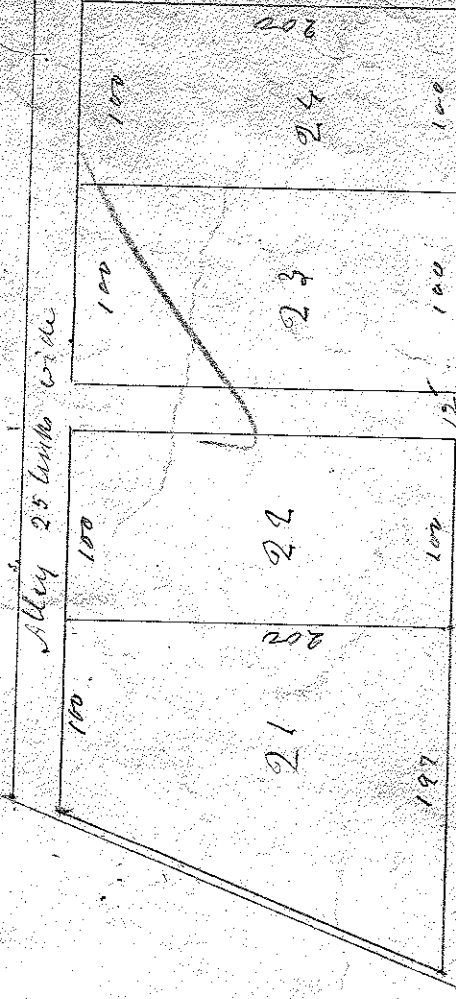
Plat of James Brennan, 1st addition to the Town of Napoleon



Said Plats to James Brennan first addition to the Town of Napoleon Henry County Ohio. The plat of town lot is on the north of fraction 22 of section 13 Town 5 N of Range 6 E. Union Street on half of which is represented on the annexed plat is 31 links wide and runs at right angles to the Clinton Pike. The course of which is north 14° 20' East. The figures on the sides and ends of the lots show their width and length in links. The whole is laid out as represented on the plat. The scale bar is one half inch to 100 links or one chain. Plans are planted at the N.W. corner of lots one (1) and six (6). Arranged May 26th 1865. A Strong Surveyor.
