

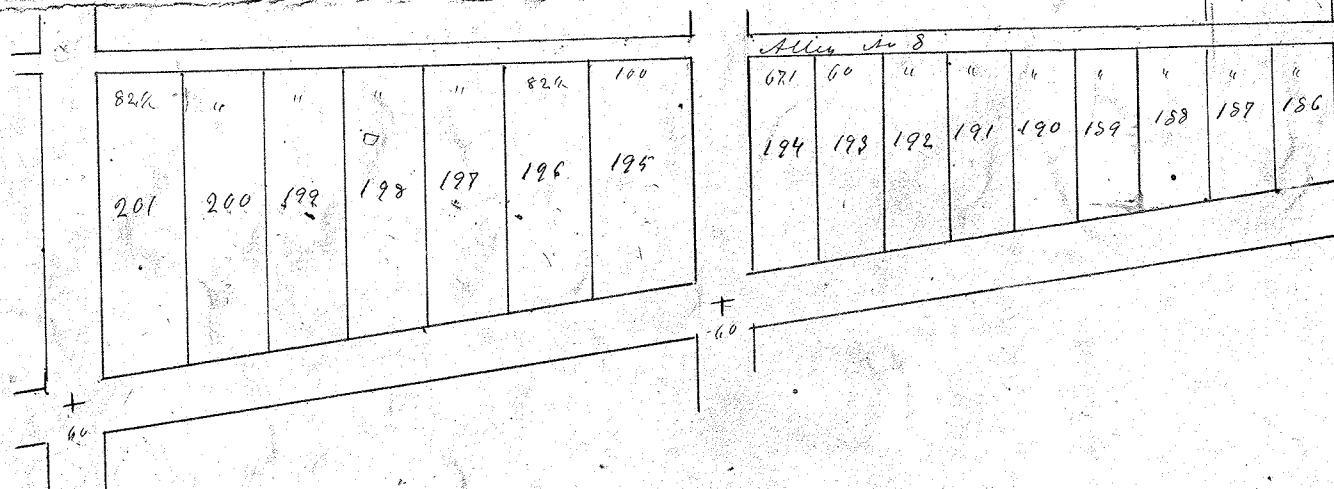
Plat of Adam Stout's first addition to the Town of Napoleon Henry County, Ohio.

Field notes to Adam Stout's first addition to the Town of Napoleon Henry County Ohio being a subdivision of a part of the West half of the South East quarter of Section fourteen (14) Town five (5) North Range six (6) East Henry County Ohio (laying North of the area a part of the West half of the North East quarter of Section number twenty three Town five north of Range six (6) East Henry County Ohio (laying North of the Asabash and Erie Canal in said County more particularly described as follows, to wit (commencing at a point on the East line of the Westing of the North East quarter of Section twenty three (23) Town Five North of Range six (6) East Henry County Ohio, 717.1 feet South of the North East corner of said West half North East quarter of said section Twenty three thence North 1° 22' 13" East along the East line of said West half N.E. 1/4 Sec 23, and along the East line of the W. 1/2 E. 1/4 section 23 14 above described 2571.8 feet thence South 58° 25' West 162 feet thence South 18° 22' East 1147.1 feet thence North 58° 25' East 192 feet thence South 1° 22' East 556 feet thence South 88° 25' thence South 1° 22' East 532.3 feet thence South 88° 25' West 1149.3 feet thence South 0° 30' East 397.5 feet thence North 80° 30' East 1390.5 East to the place of beginning containing 15.99 acres subdivided as shown by Plat. Lots numbered in red ink [black 45] + in red ink monuments planted. April 19, 1875. Geo E. Wilsen C.E.

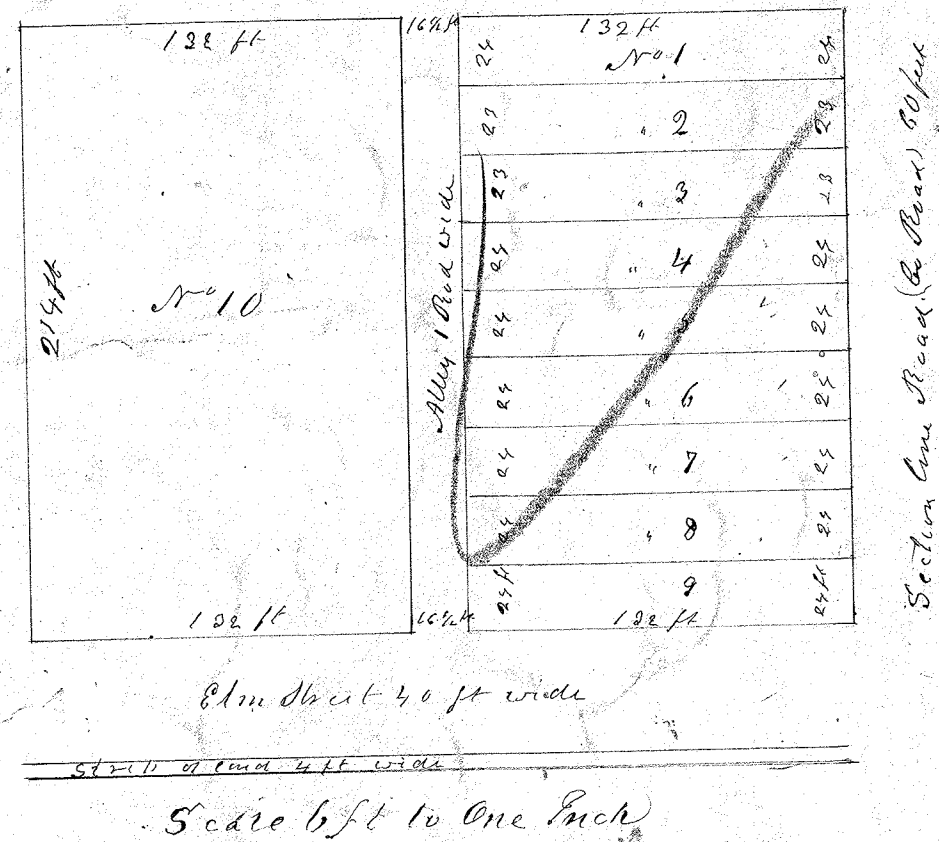
To all persons to whom these presents shall come, greeting I know ye that I Adam Stout do hereby certify that I am the owner in fee simple of the real estate described in the field notes of the accompanying Plat of Adam Stout's first addition to the Town of Napoleon Henry County Ohio, and that said Plat was made at my request and in accordance with my instructions and I do hereby adopt the same as my first addition to the Town of Napoleon Henry County Ohio and request it may be recorded as such. Witness my hand and seal this 19th day of April A.D. 1875 Adam Stout.

Plat of William Kaufmans Sub division of Lot No 1 in the village of Kaufmansville Henry County Ohio



Field notes to the annexed Plat

The lots are a subdivision of Lot No 1 in the village of Kaufmansville being located in the East half of of the North fraction of the North East quarter of Section No 2 Pleasant Township Henry County Ohio.

The lots and alleys have been laid out as marked in the Plat. The numbers of the different lots have been shown in the Plat in red ink [black]. The figures in black show the dimensions of the same in feet. The survey was made on the 11 day of May A.D. 1875

at the request of Mr. Kaufman Proprietor and in compliance with his instructions Henry Hobbs Surveyor. I Wm Kaufman do hereby certify that the foregoing survey and Plat was made at my request and in accordance with my instructions, and that I adopt the same as my subdivision of Lot No 1 of the village of Kaufmansville Henry County Ohio, and wish to have the same recorded as such William Kaufman.

The State of Ohio Be it remembered that on this 14 day of December 1875 before me Henry Hobbs a County Surveyor in and for said County personally appeared William Kaufman above named and whose signature to the foregoing survey and Plat was in his own hand and seal.
