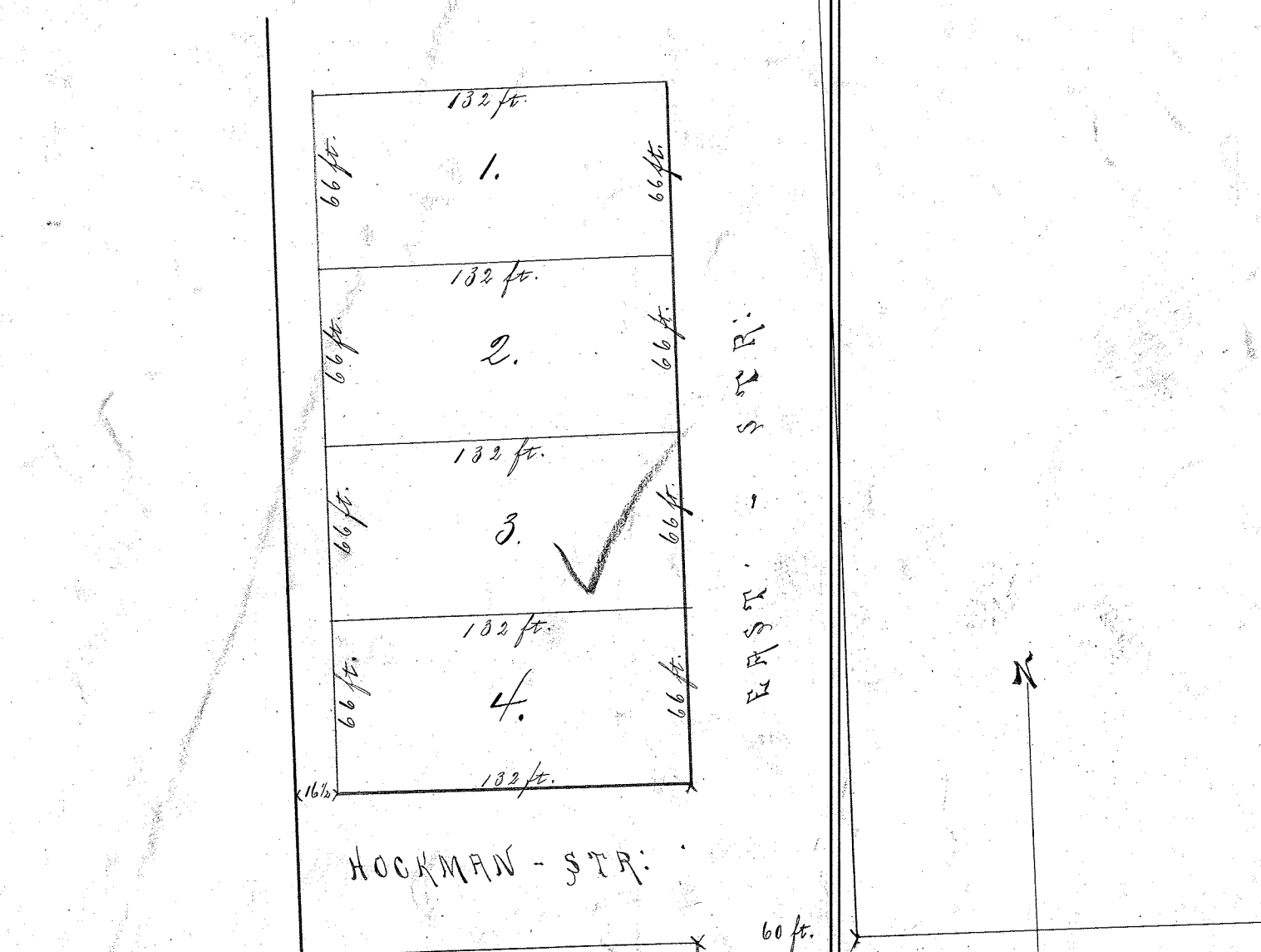


PLAT OF D. STONER'S ADDITION TO Mc CLURE



Field Notes

of D. Stoner's Addition to the Village of Mc Clure.

This addition to the village of Mc Clure is taken out of the NE cor. of the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 28, Town 5 North, Range 8 East, Henry County, Ohio and more particularly bounded and described as follows: Commencing at the NE cor. S $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 28 aforesaid, thence west 10 rods 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ links, thence south 17 rods 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ links, thence west 10 rods 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ links, thence north 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ rods 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ links to the place of beginning, in all 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres. The tract is divided into four lots as shown on the accompanying plat. The lots are 4 rods and the dimensions are shown in feet by the black figures on the margin line of the lots. They front on the road along the east line of sec. 28, said road is 60 ft. wide and named, "East Street". There is also a street on the south of said lots, named Hockman Street, 60 feet wide, extending the length of the lots from East Street west. There is also an alley in the rear of the lots extending north from Hockman Street intersecting an alley of like size in John Mc Clure's Addition to Mc Clure. The red figures on the plat represent the numbers of the lots.

I hereby certify the foregoing Plat and Field Notes to be correct as surveyed by me August 18th A. D. 1881.
