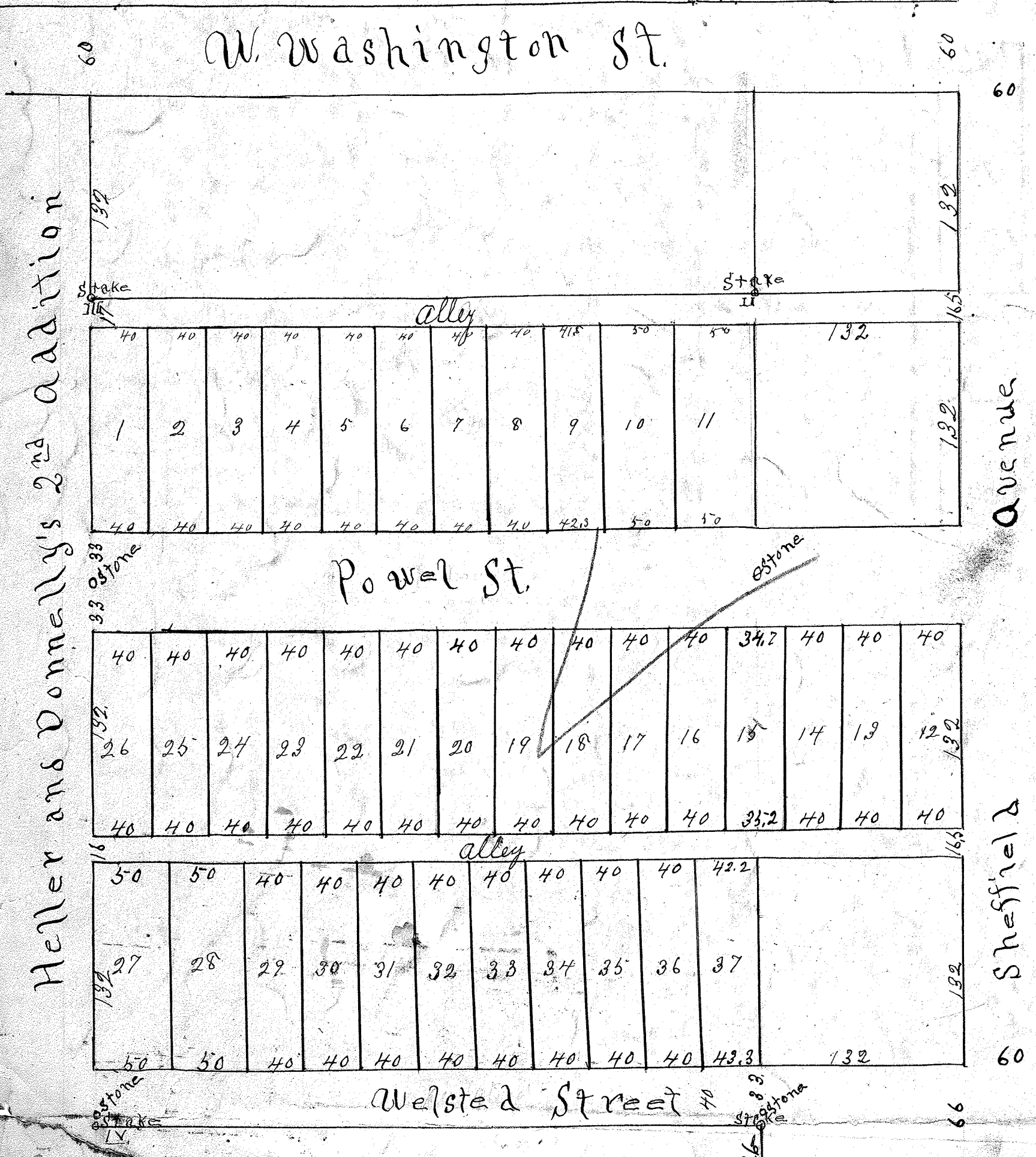


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Plat of W. P. Duffy's Glendale Addition to the Village of Napoleon Henry County Ohio.

Field notes to W. P. Duffy's Glendale Addition
to the Village of Napoleon Henry County Ohio.
This Plat is a part of the West Half of the South East quarter 14
of Section Fourteen (14) in Township Five (5) North Range Six (6) East Henry
County Ohio and is more particularly described and bounded
as follows: Starting 632.6 feet North and 162 feet West of the South
East corner of said West Half of said South East quarter 14 of Section
Fourteen (14) - (the place of which has been marked Stake I in red
ink on plat) running thence North to a point 132 feet south of
the southerly line of Washington Street in the Village of Napoleon
a distance of 535 feet (to place marked on Plat Stake II in red ink)
thence westerly and parallel with the southerly line of Washington
Street to the East line of Heller and Donnelly's 2nd Addition to the Village
of Napoleon a distance of 461 feet (to point marked on plat Stake
III in red ink) thence southerly along the East line of said Heller
and Donnelly's 2nd Addition to a point due west of said starting
point a distance of 535 feet. (to point marked on plat Stake
IV in red ink) thence East 463 feet to the point of beginning.
This tract of land contains .567 and has been shown on
Plat by a yellow border.
This plat further embraces lots Fifty nine (59) and Sixty (60)
in Adam Stouts First Addition to the Village of Napoleon
Henry County Ohio. (lots 12, 13, 14, 15 on plat). Stone have been
planted at points marked on plat. The dimensions
of lots and widths of streets and alleys have been shown
on plat in feet in black ink.
Numbers of lots appear in red ink on said Plat.
